

- Material List
- Hook: Mustad 3399 size 10
- Thread: 8/0 black
- Legs: 4 Japanese Nymph Legs
- Abdomen: paper and Swiss straw



Tie on using a black
8/0 size thread



 On the underside of your hook using a figure 8 wrap secure a Japanese Nymph Leg . Add it just far enough from the eye of the hook so you can form a thread head.



 Continue to add legs as close as possible to the first one for a total of four in all



 Be sure to minimize your thread wraps.
 You want this part of the fly very lean.



 Cut and unfurl a two inch piece of Swiss straw.



- Bunch one end of the Swiss straw and tie in on top of the hook just in front of the first legs
- At this point you will form your head



- Move your thread back and under the Swiss straw to the last pair of legs
- Then tie down the Swiss Straw to form the thorax



 Next cut a piece of scrap paper one inch by two and a half inches



 Moisten the piece you've cut and form it into a ball



 Place the paper ball onto the Swiss straw behind the last pair of legs



 Bring the corners of the Swiss straw together capturing the paper ball inside



- Bring the Swiss straw forward wrapping the paper ball inside
- Tie down behind the last pair of legs
- Note: moistening the Swiss straw will make it more flexible and smoother



Cut off the excess
 Swiss straw and
 whip finish. We will
 use a black Sharpie
 to color our spider.

 Note: this step can be eliminated by using black Swiss straw



 Once the marker ink has dried you can gently knead the abdomen to shape



 Now coat the thorax and abdomen with a good head cement or epoxy

 Note: Two or more coats will have a self leveling effect and result in a smoother finish



 Now with red paint you can add the trade mark red hour glass design on the rear of the abdomen.
 After the paint has dried add one last coat of cement



- Next we will shape the legs. It is best to do this with your fingers or small pliers.
- There is no need to heat sink



 Each leg has three joints. Therefore we will need to make three bends



 Here is a view showing the hour glass design
